INFORMATION and CONDITIONS of ENTRY

IMPORTANT. It is essential all mounted entries entering any of the Wessex Carnivals are required by law to hold a valid and current Vehicle Special Order (VSO) licence issued by the Vehicle Certification Agency (VCA) and be taxed and insured for use on the public highway.

1. Age restrictions - If entering classes 4, 6, 11, 13 or 17 should be under 17 years on the carnival day. All ground crew must be 18 years of age or older.
2. No alcohol is to be carried on, with the entry or to be consumed by the entrants in the line-up, procession or breakdown areas.
3. All mounted entries must comply with the following maximum measurements whilst in procession: Height: 5 metres; Width: 3.35 metres; Length: 30.48 metres. Floats failing to comply with the permitted measurements will be directed away from the procession assembly by a marshal.
4. Non VSO floats (Classes 5 & 6) – A single decorated unit not more than 2.55 metres wide and not charging membership or other fees. This would comply with VSO Exemption Rules. They would still need to comply with all the construction and use regulations that apply to all road going vehicle and trailers.
5. All mounted/mechanised entries must have an accessible towing eye & pin at the front of the towing vehicle, to enable a second vehicle to be attached if necessary.
6. Mounted entries failing to comply with instructions to rectify faults with their entry may be disqualified.
7. Competitive entries only will be accepted in classes 1 – 20. Trade entries will not be accepted in any of these classes. Entries can only enter one class.
8. The towing vehicle driver must be available to remove the entry from the assembly area as directed by a marshal or police officer.
9. Definition of Tableau. A motionless representation of some scene or event. No deliberate visible movements (or illusion of movement) is permitted.
10. Gaps are the bane of everyone and apart from upsetting the audience do absolutely nothing to enhance the processions. Judges & Marshals are asked to report any offenders so consideration can be taken if points should be deducted.
11. In classes 7, 9 – 13, 17 – 19 for judging purposes and for compliance all entries that are encased in a prop it will be considered as both a costume and a prop.
12. On submitting your entry you confirm that you have obtained all necessary licences and your entry will not infringe any copyright, racial or decency issues, you accept that any infringement of the aforementioned is the responsibility of the entrant and not the carnival you are entering and that the carnival committee will not accept any responsibility for any action taken for infringement by your entry.
13. The committee reserve the right to refuse entry, withhold appearance money, deduct points or disqualify an entry at any time.
14. Any entry which is considered to be of a vulgar or objectionable nature and likely to cause controversy will be refused.
15. If the procession halts for more than two minutes entries shall be permitted to relax until the procession restarts.
16. We reserve the right to refuse entry to any entry which constitutes a Health & Safety risk, any special effects should be cleared by the relevant committee and be accompanied by a Risk Assessment.
17. All entries take part in the procession at their own risk and responsibility. Each entry needs to ensure they have adequate insurance cover in place to protect their personnel as well as the general public should a claim arise. All vehicles should be insured for carnival use and for mounted entries a five million public liability cover is required. The committee accept no responsibility for an entry's non-compliance with this condition!
18. Any entries failing to abide by these Conditions of Entry or not following the instructions of the marshals will not be allowed into the procession.
19. All entries must complete the whole route to qualify for prize/appearance monies unless cleared with the committee prior.



20. Competitors littering the Highway in any way will be automatically disqualified. They will also be charged for any cleaning which may arise. The throwing or spraying of liquids will result in Points Deduction or Disqualification. Nothing should be thrown from your entry.
21. No **live animals** or pushchairs will be permitted into the procession as any part of the entry or with Ground Crew, excluding Guide Dogs.
22. No counter marching or static displays are allowed.
23. The committee reserve the right to postpone or cancel the whole or part of the event which would only be done as a last resort or the situation is beyond their control.
24. The committee are not responsible if you enter in the wrong class, if you enter online you should check your entry is correct after you press submit, details of what you have entered will then appear on the screen which you can print off as a receipt your entry has been received.
25. All judging will take place on the route between the start and finishing signs. Classes 1 to 6 will be judged on the content of their entry between the front and the rear procession numbers. It is your responsibility to ensure that your numbers are positioned to show what you want to be judged. This does not affect judging for the Best Dressed Towing Vehicle Driver.
26. If after submitting an entry you find you have to withdraw you should advise the entries secretary without delay.
27. Once an entry is in motion personnel for their own safety must be prevented from entering the gaps in the train.
28. All results announced on the night at the Youth Club at approx. 10pm.
29. To qualify for appearance money standards of entry must meet the judging requirements. Wessex members will receive additional appearance money Classes 1 – 4 £25, Classes 5-6 £20, Class 7 £10 Classes 8-13 £5
30. All cups & trophies awarded are the property of the committee and should be returned and engraved by the 31st July 2024. Any damage or loss to the aforementioned should be reported immediately. Trophies should be returned to John Peel Café, High Street, Shaftesbury or Wessex Carnival Meeting in July 2024.
31. Local entry classification will normally be within the SP7 postal area for entries base or at the discretion of the procession secretary.
32. Due to limited space in the assembly area, vehicles accompanying entries must be moved to the either Youth club car park or Public carpark by Hine Motors.
33. The closing date for all your entry will be Friday 1st September to ensure its inclusive in the programme. Entries are accepted until Wednesday 27th.
